#NeglectMatters

Neglect is the ongoing failure to meet a child's basic needs, and the most common form of child abuse across the UK.

It's important all the children who need this help and support get it as quickly as possible before problems grow worse. However, research shows that many people do not act on their concerns because they worry about being wrong.

The Neglect Matters campaign aims to help people recognise the signs of child abuse and neglect but – more importantly - have the confidence to report any concerns, no matter how small, to the localised Helpline number of 0808 800 5000.

The consequences for you and other road users can be much worse







Why is it dangerous to use a handheld mobile device while driving?

- **1. Cognitive distraction** –driving while using your phone requires you to concentrate on two 'thinking' tasks at once which our brains are not programmed to do effectively.
- **2. Physical impairment** –holding your phone leaves only one hand in control of the steering wheel.
- **3. Visual impairment** –when you glance down at your phone you take your eyes off the road ahead. Looking away for just a couple of seconds mean you can miss
